Also, by registering online you can save \$5 off the on-site price for an Adult Registration. Online registration closes on May 26th at 11:59pm PST.

Remember, your \$15 online (or \$20 at the door) adult admission is valid for both Saturday and Sunday. Sunday admission reduced.

The student rate for ages 13-17 is only \$5.

For children 12 and under, admission is FREE with a paid adult admission.

You may have noticed that we changed how we manage prizes. This was not our choice, but since the convention occurs in Oregon, we must follow Oregon laws and regulations SEA-PAC has several prize groups. Emergency Communications:

EMCOMM: Building on the success of prior years

Facing a world that is both increasingly dangerous and complex, radio amateurs often seek to apply their knowledge and skills to the benefit of their communities. This is part of the DNA of amateur radio, closing gaps in critical communications during major emergencies and disasters.

The Pacific Northwest is blessed with many active and contributing radio amateurs who are engaged in emergency communications (EMCOMM) either through their local clubs, ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Service) or other groups. Learning how best to apply their amateur radio capabilities during emergencies is the focus of the annual EMCOMM Workshop at SEAPAC. This year the workshop will highlight more advanced didactic topics (morning session) and simulated emergency operations consisting of a mock EOC (Emergency Operating Center) and strategically placed satellite groups operating various modes (phone, Winlink, etc.) and frequencies (HF, VHF/UHF, GMRS, MURS). The afternoon session will be a fully hands-on opportunity. Radios will be supplied.

Our workshop this year will find both basic and more advanced EMCOMM operators benefiting from the information and hands-on approach. The EMCOMM Workshop is a full-day pre-conference event conducted on Friday, May 31, 2024.

Participants are encouraged to bring their personal or club EMCOMM Go-Kit or Man-Pack. There will be an opportunity to share the design and features of your system during the day.

Contesting

The Contest Workshop features experienced contesters who will offer suggestions on how to get started, improve your station and ability, and strategies to try. Bring questions. Speakers include:

- Mike Ritz, W7VO (ARRL Second VP): N1MM+ operation to log your contacts.
- Bill Lippert, AC0W (Dakota Division Director): Bill manages several popular contests, and will offer a view behind the scenes before, during, and after a contest from several perspectives.
- Dave Cherba, WZ8T (Clark County ARC VP): Dave will explain what can be learned by mining data from other contesters to learn some of their possible strategies that can help improve your score in later contests.
- Scott Rosenfeld, N7JI (OR Section Mgr): Scott likes DX-peditions and contesting and will offer suggestions from the other side of pile-ups.
